





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM SNAPSHOT

The past few years have been a time of change and challenges for the local community. Pandemic related lockdowns and restrictions have caused uncertainty and have forced local businesses and tourism operators to adapt to an ever-changing business environment. The past few years have also been a time of change for Elgin County Economic Development and Tourism. While pandemic related staff redeployments and other staffing changes presented new challenges, the Department worked together to embrace these challenges and to create a new strategic vision for how we engage the community to make Elgin County an amazing place to live, work, and play.

NEW STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Elgin County Economic Development and Tourism began 2022 by re-evaluating how we spend our time and resources so that we can better support our local entrepreneurs and foster an environment of opportunity for the County, its residents and businesses. We found that we need to re-engage our local business community to learn about their needs, let them know about the services we offer, and connect them to other relevant resources.

We learned that Elgin County is home to many innovative entrepreneurs who have not only adapted to the ever-changing business environment, but who have also thrived and developed creative solutions to the challenges they have faced. To support this amazing community, we will continue to champion the creation of a network of entrepreneurs that can work together to grow their businesses and attract new investment to Elgin County.

Adopted by County Council in June of 2022, the 2022-2025 Economic Development and Tourism Strategy will direct the efforts of the department over the next four years. As we continue to engage our business community, we are committed to reimagining our services and rebuilding how we do economic development in Elgin County.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT

WELCOME HOME CAMPAIGN

Over the years, Economic Development and Tourism staff have created several countywide, promotional videos to showcase Elgin County's stunning natural landscapes, exciting recreational activities, and friendly communities. These videos have generated interest in Elgin County and have encouraged tourism in Elgin County.

The demand for online video content has only increased, and it is important to keep video content fresh and current, as it is an excellent way to portray Elgin's quality of life to residents, visitors, and investors alike. In 2022, Economic Development and Tourism staff worked with a local videographer to create seven (7) short videos that feature each of the Local Municipalities within Elgin County. Together these videos were featured in a summer-long video campaign.

Over the past two (2) years, residents have used their homes in new and different ways. For many people, their homes became their office, their classroom, their shopping centre, and their entertainment destination. As many pandemic related restrictions were lifted in 2022, these videos were designed to encourage residents to re-explore their communities and to feel a sense of pride for where they live, work, and play. The videos featured familiar sites, people, and establishments, reminding residents why they chose Elgin County as their home. In addition to encouraging a sense of pride in residents, the campaign also targeted future residents, visitors, and potential investors.

Beginning in July 2022, the Local Municipal videos were featured on the County's social media platforms. Each video was featured for a period of one (1) week. During this week, social media posts were dedicated to businesses and tourist attractions located in that municipality.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT

ELGINCENTIVES

In 2022, staff reviewed the Elgincentives Community Improvement Plan (CIP) and presented recommendations to County Council for how the program could be improved going forward.

Council also approved the continued funding of the Elgincentives CIP and directed staff to work with Elgin's Local Municipal Partners to review the program annually to ensure program alignment with community need. Council will identify annually during the budgeting process the extent to which they will participate in the Elgincentives program.

Through the Elgincentives Community Improvement Plan, Elgin County Economic Development offers grants to eligible business owners and tenants of lands and buildings in key sectors and areas of economic activity in order to:

- Stimulate economic growth and diversification.
- Enhance the quality of place for residents and visitors; and,
- Improve the stability and sustainability of the tax base.

BUSINESS SUPPORTS

BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FACILITATION

Entrepreneurs and small businesses are the backbone of Elgin County's economy and Elgin County Economic Development has made the support and cultivation of these businesses a priority. One of the main goals under the new strategic plan is to meet with local entrepreneurs, listen to their needs, and develop a good understanding of the local community's market, assets, and needs.

To have a boots on the ground presence in the community, the Department recruited and hired a full-time Business Enterprise Facilitator (BEF). The BEF has become the primary contact for entrepreneurs and small business owners in Elgin County. Through regular visits in each local municipality, the BEF has begun cultivating a network of direct contacts in the business community. Listening to the needs of local entrepreneurs, the BEF has worked with business owners to provide collaborative assistance in overcoming challenges by working with other economic development agencies, our local municipal partners, and other organizations to provide creative solutions.

Engaging with local business owners, the BEF has been able to connect businesses to relevant funding opportunities and to help market and promote local business through leveraging the County's networks and online presence to showcase Elgin's business community and local opportunities.

BUSINESS VISITS

While engaging with the local business community, the Business Enterprise Facilitator (BEF) has helped business owners identify current challenges and has worked with them to resolve these issues. Challenges have included confusion over local planning policies, uncertainty over who to contact regarding municipal infrastructure, questions about business loans, and inquiries about funding support for innovative solutions to labour shortages.

One business owner had questions about municipal policies on awnings. The BEF helped the owner to consult the municipality's downtown plan for confirmation that a new awning would not violate any existing policy.

Another business owner was planning an exterior façade project that included safety enhancements. The BEF connected the owner with Engineering Services to discuss implications to the existing sidewalk and highway.

A local entrepreneur had concerns that a municipal parking sign had been installed too closely to their business sign and was blocking its visibility. The BEF facilitated a conversation between the business owner and the local municipality.

Another entrepreneur had expended significant resources to renovate a rental unit and was unexpectedly informed that the owner was selling the building. The entrepreneur had built a significant local client base but was unable to afford purchase of the unit on the short timeline provided. The BEF referred the entrepreneur to the Elgin Business Resource Centre for loan consideration.

A local farmer developed a technological innovation for a cucumber picking aid that dramatically reduces the required number of farm workers. The BEF connected the farmer to the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation, and Trade to be considered for a grant opportunity.

BUSINESS SUPPORTS

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CENTRE

The Small Business Enterprise Centre (SBEC) is funded by Elgin County, the St. Thomas Economic Development Corporation and the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade. Through their delivery of the Summer Company and Starter Company Plus programs, SBEC focuses primarily on business counselling, loans, and supports to youth.

Summer Company provides youth looking to become entrepreneurs for the summer with \$1,500 in start-up money to kick start their business, as well as ongoing advice and mentorship. Students also receive an additional \$1,500 in the fall after they have successfully completed the program.

Starter Company Plus provides entrepreneurs 18 years and older with up to \$5,000 and professional mentoring to expand or start a business in Elgin County.

Beginning in 2021, SBEC also oversaw the Horton Farmers' Market. The Market is a vibrant gathering place to buy fresh, local produce, socialize and experience community, This year, the Market offered the best fruits and vegetables, fish, meat, plants, herbs, flowers, soaps and lotions, honey, maple syrup, baked goods, artisanal foods and unique hand-crafted items our region has to offer.

In 2022, Elgin County maintained its membership with the Ontario Food Cluster, an organization whose mandate is to drive international investment to Ontario's food and beverage industries.



MINISTRY INVOLVEMENT

2022 saw Elgin's relations with the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) and the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade continue. These relationships have allowed Elgin to showcase its vacant buildings, properties, and business parks to those working directly with investment at the respective Ministries. As a result, Elgin was able to respond to various inquiries and requests for information for potential investment to Elgin County.

VACANT LAND INVENTORY

In 2021, the County of Elgin developed a Vacant Land Inventory to provide an overview of vacant industrial, commercial, and employment lands in Elgin County. The inventory has been posted on the Economic Development website and is designed to assist potential investors, businesses or site selectors in researching and identifying properties for potential new locations, expansion or relocation of their operations to Elgin County.

Savour Elgin is the County's culinary trail that takes visitors on a delectable journey to the area's finest food and drink establishments, farmers' markets, and agritourism operations.



CYCLE TOURISM

The County of Elgin held a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the official launch of the Highwheel Way Cycling Route and the unveiling of the Doolittle Mural on June 28th at the Port Bruce Pavillion. This event coincided with Ontario Bike Month, a month dedicated by the Province to demonstrate the importance of cycling for maintaining healthy lifestyles, reducing traffic congestion, and increasing economic development through cycle tourism.

Cycling has become an ever-popular form of transportation within the County of Elgin for residents and visitors alike. When the County's Engineering Department created a cycle route on Imperial Road (Highway 73), from the Town of Aylmer to the village of Port Bruce, staff from the County's Economic Development and Tourism department leaped at the opportunity to brand this route. Drawing upon knowledge from other County departments, as well as politicians from the Town of Aylmer and the Township of Malahide, the name Highwheel Way: from Pedal to Paddle was formed. This name celebrates Elgin's cycling history through not only a branded bike route but also on a mural that honours a historic local cyclist, Mr. Doolittle.
